CILOs 1- 4	<p>The course comprises a series of research seminars spreading over Semester A and Semester B of the same academic year, or over Semester B of one academic year and Semester A of the following academic year. In order to fulfil the coursework requirement, students must attend a total of 10 seminars.</p> <p>Students are free to choose the seminars according to their own interests and areas of study. They may also consult their supervisors for advice.</p> <p>Participation will be strictly monitored with the implementation of an attendance policy. An attendance record will be given to students prior to the commencement of the course. Students who attend a research seminar must request the speaker to sign the attendance record at the end of the seminar. After attending all the 10 seminars, students must also request the Research Degree Coordinator to sign the completed attendance record.</p>		

**Grading of Student Achievement:** Refer to Grading of Courses in the Academic Regulations (Attachment) and to the Explanatory Notes.

Assessment will be on a Pass/Fail basis. A student taking the course will be awarded PASS if he/she has attended at least 10 seminars in the two semesters. A student taking the course will be awarded FAIL if he/she has attended less than 10 seminars in the two semesters.
